3		27 of Attachment 2 to CA-NLH-6. Did Hydro review the RSP in this Application and
4		the GRA: 1) on the basis of these objectives, and 2) with the participation of any of
5		the Parties involved in the RSP Review? If so, please file a copy of the review and all
6		correspondence with the Parties.

9	A.	Hydro is proposing in the current RSP filing that the RSP rules be revised effective
10		September 1, 2013 to allocate the net load variation for both NP and IC on
11		customer energy ratios, that is, in the same manner as the fuel price variation is
12		allocated. This recommended change to the RSP would primarily meet the
13		objective "To provide for fair apportionment of costs among the customers
14		impacted by the RSP" but would also continue to meet the following objectives:
15		 To provide for acceptable levels of rate and revenue stability for
16		customers and Hydro;
17		 To provide for regulatory efficiency by allowing changes in rates to
18		recover changes in prudently incurred fuel costs without requiring a
19		general rate proceeding; and
20		To provide for timely changes in rates and avoid material changes in the
21		price signal that would promote inappropriate consumption decisions by
22		customers.
23		Hydro's GRA Evidence, page 4.17, outlines a proposal to modify the RSP to include
24		provisions for energy supply variations in power purchases, diesel and gas turbine

generation in addition to the existing variations in Holyrood fuel costs. Broadening

the provisions of the RSP to include all of Hydro's supply sources on the Island

interconnected system would be in keeping with the RSP objectives above.
