

1 Q. Assuming that the accumulated load variation surplus for the period January 1,
2 2007 to December 31, 2007 did not form part of the Rate Stabilization Plan Surplus
3 intended to be allocated by the Orders-in-Council, please identify all necessary
4 changes that would have to be made to Hydro's Application and to the supporting
5 evidence filed to date for Hydro's Application to fully reflect that assumption,
6 including without limiting the foregoing all necessary changes to Tables 1, 2, 3 and 4
7 of Hydro's July 2013 Rate Stabilization Evidence, and to all schedules and
8 appendices supporting or relating to those Tables.

11 A. OC2013-089, as amended, defines the Rate Stabilization Plan Surplus (RSP Surplus)
12 as the accumulated Load Variation component of the RSP for the period January 1,
13 2007 to August 31, 2013. Redefining the period to exclude the 2007 would result in
14 a lower amount of RSP Surplus. Since the total amount of the accumulated Load
15 Variation component of the RSP for the period January 1, 2007 to August 31, 2013
16 is integral to the rates policy direction given it should not be altered. Therefore, it is
17 Hydro's position that rates and related matters should be finalized at this time
18 without further review. Refer also to the response to CA-NLH-20.
