1 IC-NLH-01 Please provide details of the cost of the fluid replacement alternative, noted to be
2 of a "similar cost" to replacing a transformer, delineated at page 8, lines 10-19, of
3 Hydro's Report regarding the Replacement of Excitation Transformers (Bay
4 d'Espoir);

5 IC-NLH-02 The Table at page 1 of Hydro's Internal Expert Analysis of SD Myers Test
6 Results shows transformers RT3, RT4 and RT5 have remaining lives of 25%,
7 36% and 42% (respectively). What would be the anticipated replacement date of
8 each of transformers RT3, RT4 and RT5 in light of this?

10 IC-NLH-03 At page 4, lines 4-6, of Hydro's Report regarding the Replacement on Excitation
11 Transformers (Bay d'Espoir), Hydro states:

13 "Efficiencies in engineering, project management, and bulk
14 procurement, as well as disposal of the existing
15 transformers and their fluid, reduce the overall cost when
16 all transformers are replaced as part of one project."


18 Please provide details for the reduction in overall costs expected if all

All of which is respectfully submitted on behalf of the Island Industrial Customers.



