1 CA-NLH-1 At page 8, Hydro attempted to put T5 back into service in the
2 Spring of 2014, but was unable to do so due to its current
3 condition. How long has T5 been out of service?
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
5 CA-NLH-2 Since the time T5 has not been in service, why have there been no
6 assessments made as to the extent of work that needs to be carried
7 out, the time it will take, how much it will cost and whether T5 is
8 in fact repairable?
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10 CA-NLH-3 When was Hydro's forecast for Wabush completed? Does the
11 forecast take into account recent developments such as the mine
12 closure? What impact does the mine closure have on the need for
13 this project?
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15 CA-NLH-4 Hydro's Application at paragraph 7 states that the relocation and
16 installation of the transformer along with the required substation
17 modifications is the least cost option over the long term. In the
18 absence of any information about the cost to repair T5, how is this
19 statement supportable?
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21 CA-NLH-5 Has Hydro determined the cause of the excessive moisture levels
22 found in T5? Is there a method to prevent same from occurring in
23 other transformers?
