	Does Hydro possess any reports from its staff in Postville that would indicate that
	the current configuration is hindering their ability to conduct day to day
	maintenance work at the facility or is creating any other difficulties?
A.	The following is an excerpt from an email from the Electrical/Mechanical
	Supervisor for the Transmission and Rural Operations Labrador region on
	September 12, 2013:
	The existing plant configuration gives very little room to do any significant
	maintenance. For example, we have a major overhaul coming in the next 4-6
	weeks. When this job begins, the plant will be totally covered in parts on the
	floor from one end to the over (sic) with no room to work. Even if you look a
	slightly less significant job, such as replace a cylinder pack or cylinder head.
	You still would create a risky work environment full of trip hazards,
	increasing a likely hood of injury. If you remove the oil drums, consumable
	cabinets, some of the tooling, storage bins for maintenance, etc it would
	make a great difference.
