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Q. (page 45, lines 1-12) Are there any reasons to believe that 1-to-5-year forecasts of electricity sales and revenue are likely, on balance, to be less accurate or reliable in a relatively slow-growth province, such as Newfoundland and Labrador, than they will be in higher-growth provinces such as Alberta, British Columbia, and Ontario? Please explain the various forecasting-related considerations, both pro and con, that are weighed in arriving at the answer to this question.

A. Newfoundland Power does not have comparative information with respect to the relative accuracy of 1 to 5-year forecasts of electricity sales and revenue for slow-growth provinces and high-growth provinces. Therefore, Newfoundland Power is unable to make any observations on the comparative accuracy or reliability of such forecasts.
