Q. (page 121, lines 11-12) Under Rate 2.1, will low consumption customers see a higher increase than high consumption customers given the increase in the Basic Customer Charge?

A. All Rate 2.1 customers in will see an increase of \$1.20 per month due to the proposed increase in the Basic Customer Charge. Customers that in some months are charged the minimum monthly charge for three phase service will see a somewhat larger increase, as the minimum monthly charge for three phase service is proposed to increase by \$2.40 per month.¹

In percentage terms, larger usage customers will see lower percentage increases than lower consumption customers. The response to CA-NP-197 provides more detailed information on rate impacts for customers in different consumption ranges.

Because the current Rate 2.1 energy charge exceeds both the embedded and marginal cost, and the current Basic Customer Charge is lower than the total of the marginal customer and distribution facilities costs and the agreed-to maximum Basic Customer Charge, it is appropriate to recover any increased revenue from the Rate 2.1 class through an increase in the Basic Customer Charge. This matter is reviewed in detail in the *Rate Design Review*, Volume 2, Supporting Materials, Tab 13.
