Q. (page 2 of 4) Is the three-phase minimum charge set equal to two times the Basic Customer Charge for Rate 2.1 justified on the basis of cost?

A. Yes. The minimum monthly charge for three-phase customers is set at 2 times the basic customer charge to ensure a reasonable recovery of the higher cost investment for three-phase customers.

The average additional capital cost of providing the service drop, metering and two additional transformers required for three-phase service is approximately \$3,500. This additional investment requires an annual recovery of \$332 or approximately \$28 per month.¹

Having a minimum charge that is \$17.90 per month higher for three-phase service than single phase service (i.e., under proposed rates) permits a minimum recovery in revenue of approximately 64% of the additional cost of providing three-phase service.

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Based on an annual fixed charge rate of 9.5% for distribution plant.
