Q. What would be the pitfalls and benefits associated with the approval of an
assessment of one of the units this year with NLH applying in subsequent
years for approval of expenditures related to the assessment of the other
units in a later year if it was deemed necessary?

A.

If the assessment had to be performed as three separate capital budget projects in three different years, the cost of performing the overall project would increase. The information gathered during the first two years would be of little or no use until completion of the last year's scope of work because all the information would not be available until the end of the last year. This is analogous to attempting to ascertain the condition of a used car one is considering purchasing by inspecting one third of the car each year. The condition of the entire car, and therefore its value, cannot be established until the entire car has been inspected.
