Q: Re: Liberty Report, Conclusion 2.22 (pp. 33)

The added dimension of demand management this year, and in particular the very high importance that needs to be placed on it, <u>make work this upcoming year different and particularly critical</u>. For example, the range of assumptions made about the Muskrat Falls schedule and costs may have great bearing on what programs make sense from a reliability and cost perspective. The work to be undertaken must proceed with dispatch despite what Liberty would observe to be uncertain estimates of project schedule and cost. Liberty does not make this observation on the basis of examination of actual plans or progress, but on the basis of what decades of experience says about megaprojects in the utility industry. (underlining added)

Please clarify to what "work this upcoming year" reference is made, which is "particularly critical".

 Please elaborate on other information which is currently unavailable, in addition to the example provided of the range of assumptions made about the Muskrat Falls schedule and costs, which are also essential for this critical work to be carried out.

A. The critical work this year consists of the underlying analytical and alternativesidentification work to be performed by the companies, and, if warranted, any
ensuing stakeholder and regulatory processes. The only areas that we found
important to emphasize in terms of distinguishing the work from that performed
earlier concern the Muskrat Falls information and the focus on demand
management (the latter of which we believe the companies already had committed
to addressing).
