11		Please specify what is meant by "short term" and "long term" in the context of
12		Recommendation 2.16.

14		Can Liberty propose a timetable for steps to be taken by Hydro, by NP and by
15		the Board in order to ensure that these resources are made available as
16		promptly as possible?
17		
18		
19	A.	Short-term means the time prior to the in-service dates of Muskrat Falls and the
20		Labrador Island Link. Long-term means the time following those dates. Liberty
21		specifically means actual in-service dates. Consideration of alternatives should not
22		assume that there is no potential for delay in the availability of capacity and energy
23		from Muskrat Falls. To the contrary, experience with mega-projects in the utility
24		industry lends credence to the need for a robust consideration of schedule
25		outcomes.

27		We do not have a timetable to propose at this point.
