Q. Further to the response to PUB-NLH-018, state when Hydro first became aware there could be a capacity deficit and the amount of the anticipated deficit at that time and now. Explain in the response why Hydro has not to date initiated an application for approval to construct any additional capacity to meet the forecast deficit and what action Hydro has taken to provide the necessary additional generation.

A. A capacity deficit is defined by the Loss of Load Hours (LOLH) exceeding 2.8 hours.
This is a probabilistic measure that considers the expected load and the generation available. It is determined through use of a computer model called Strategist. The

model uses as input the forecast load, generation maintenance requirements and a probability of generation forced outages.¹

A capacity deficit was first identified in the 2008 Strategist results, with the deficit projected to occur in 2012. This deficit has moved out further into the future with subsequent Strategist analyses. The load has evolved with decline of paper production and the delays in the startup of the Vale processing facility. These are considered major drivers behind the timing changes to the potential deficit. The most recent analysis in 2012 shows the capacity deficit occurring in 2015.

From the Strategist analysis, Hydro determined that the combustion turbine was the least cost option. In 2011, Hydro commenced the preliminary site analysis, budget and engineering work. In 2012, Hydro determined that the combustion turbine would be best established at Holyrood. Hydro was finalizing an application

for the Board in late 2013 and evaluating other alternatives to ensure the proposed $% \left\{ 1\right\} =\left\{ 1\right\}$
solution was the lowest cost for customers. In addition, with the decision to
increase the blackstart generation capacity at the Holyrood, Hydro is assessing the
appropriateness of previous conclusions. Hydro intends to submit its application in

the next month with a proposed solution to meet the projected capacity deficit.
