Does Hydro own steel towers and if so, does it use coating to extend the life? Please explain why or why not and provide a cost benefit analysis comparing coating to replacement of the steel tower.

A. Approximately one third of Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro's ("Hydro") transmission lines are built exclusively with steel towers constructed from hot dip galvanized steel members and bolts. Other than in areas exposed to industrial pollution (i.e., Come by Chance), steel towers do not typically corrode as a result of normal environmental factors. Hydro has several towers in this area that have been coated; however, outside of this area, Hydro does not currently use coatings to extend the life of steel towers since the level of corrosion does not indicate that it will be necessary.
