16	A.	a)	Muskrat Falls Project ("Project") costs not recovered through customer rates are charged to	
17			the Supply Cost Variance Deferral Account for future collection from customers.	
18			Additionally, financing costs are applied to the Supply Cost Variance Deferral Account to	
19			reflect Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro's ("Hydro") short-term borrowing costs. There	
20			are no negative financial impacts on Hydro from short-term deferral of Project costs.	
21		b)	Deferral of Project costs increase the supply cost amounts to be funded by either future	
22			customers or through rate mitigation funding. Details on the final rate mitigation plan are	
23			not yet available; therefore, the projected rate impacts cannot be provided.	
24		c)	Yes, the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador ("Government") has been made aware	
25			of the impact of delayed recovery of Project costs from customers and the potential for	
26			increased rate mitigation requirements in the future. While the Government has not made	

- any further commitment beyond the \$190.4 million grant provided in March, the letter dated April 14, 2023 reiterated Government's commitment to rate mitigation.¹
- d) The letter from the Minister does not specifically address whether the Project Cost Recovery
 Rider should decrease. Please refer to Hydro's response to PUB-NLH-001 for the rationale
 for Hydro's proposal of no increase in the Project Cost Recovery Rider at this time.
