2 Further to the response to PUB-NLH-018, please list every other figure or picture that was used
3 for “illustrative” examples in the details provided for the proposed 2024 capital projects and
4 programs. Is it Hydro’s practice to use “illustrative” pictures to reflect the condition of assets
5 that are proposed for a capital project and not pictures of the actual assets that are the subject
6 of the program or project for which approval is requested?

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9 A. Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro’s (“Hydro”) general practice within capital budget proposals
10 is to provide pictures of actual asset condition where required to facilitate appropriate review
11 and approval. Hydro’s Terminal Station Asset Management Overview is not a proposal for
12 capital expenditure, but rather a document that is included to provide context on Hydro’s asset
13 management practices within terminal stations, and provide support for the relevant capital
14 expenditure proposals. Therefore, the figures within this overview are not of specific assets
15 being proposed for a specific capital project, but are included to illustrate the types of assets
16 encompassed by the associated programs and the typical degradation, failure mode, etc. that
17 can be experienced, as this is often common from year to year.
