2 Some of Hydro's in-service failure programs do not include interest and escalation costs (i.e.

Thermal In-Service Failures, Hydraulic In-Service Failures, and Diesel In-Service Failures). When

are interest and escalation costs included in program estimates?

A. Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro ("Hydro") includes interest during construction ("IDC") in the estimate for any construction project where the duration of the first dollar spent to project closeout is longer than six months. As assets associated with in-service failures are generally urgent in nature and placed in service relatively quickly once identified, Hydro typically does not include interest on these programs. Other programs also don't typically include IDC as the individual scopes within the program generally don't meet the six-month criteria.

Hydro typically applies escalation to all programs and projects in its capital budget applications ("CBA"). Hydro notes that there was a minor discrepancy in its 2025 CBA concerning how estimates were entered for the 2025 scope of a small number of these In-Service Failure Programs, which resulted in the exclusion of escalation. As Hydro's In-Service Failures Programs are budgeted based on historical averages and do not have a defined scope, Hydro does not expect this discrepancy to materially impact these programs, and will review the application of escalation on its In-Service Failure Programs in its next CBA.
