Q. Reference: Schedule 5 2024 Capital Expenditures Overview, pages B-38-52.

Hydro has provided tables showing budget, actual expenditures, and variances for the projects and programs completed in 2023. Some tables include both annual and program data, while others only provide program or annual data. What is Hydro's rationale for reporting cost data differently?

- A. The provisional Capital Budget Application Guidelines, set forth by the Board of Commissioners of Public Utilities require Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro ("Hydro") to provide a detailed explanation for each variance where the actual expenditure was greater than the approved expenditure by both \$100,000 and 10%. For programs and projects that span multiple calendar years, it is possible to have a reportable variance for the overall program or project and/or a reportable variance in the annual expenditures within that multi-year program or project. For the tables in the 2024 Capital Expenditure Overview, dollar amounts are provided for annual variances that are greater than both \$100,000 and 10% and total project variances that are greater than both \$100,000 and 10%. Any given project or program may have an annual reportable variance, a total reportable variance, or both. Examples are as follows:
 - The Replace Powerhouse Station Service Panel 1 (2023–2024) Upper Salmon Project³ had 2023 expenditures that exceeded the 2023 budget by more than both \$100,000 and 10% and the overall project is also forecast to exceed the budget by more than both \$100,000 and 10%. Variance explanations were provided for both the 2023 (annual) variance and the forecasted total project variance in the 2023 Capital Expenditures and Carryover Report.
 - The Replace Elevator Motors and Control Equipment Hydro Place Project⁴ had total project expenditures that exceeded the budget by more than both \$100,000 and 10%;

however, the variance in the annual 2023 expenditures was not greater than both \$100,000 and 10%, as the over-expenditure was experienced in the years prior to 2023.

As such, a variance explanation was required only for the total project variance in the 2023 Capital Expenditures and Carryover Report.

• The Replace Light- and Heavy-Duty Vehicles (2023–2025) Program⁵ had 2023 expenditures that exceeded the 2023 budget by more than both \$100,000 and 10%, due to the early delivery of some vehicles in 2023 that were originally expected to arrive in 2024. As this did not impact the total program budget, a variance explanation was required only for the 2023 (annual) expenditures in the 2023 Capital Expenditures and Carryover Report.
