There is a significant increase in forecast program cost over the period from 2024 to 2029 when compared with the period from 2019 to 2023. What factors are driving these cost increases?

Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro's growing utilization of technology requires a higher investment to improve and expand the functionality of existing applications across all areas of the business,¹ the development or implementation of newer software that better fits the business requirements, and the implementation of new systems to complement the existing applications. In addition, the number of operational technology ("OT") assets has grown significantly in recent years as a result of improvements to the security posture of the OT applications, causing increased investment requirements. OT experienced some resource constraints in previous years that limited the scope that could be accomplished for a number of years. As a result, items were prioritized and some investments were deferred to recent and upcoming years. Finally, the technology industry has experienced the same impact of inflation that has been experienced in other industries since the COVID-19 pandemic.
