- Q. (Reference Application) Please confirm that NP is requesting Board approval of capital expenditures totaling \$120,042,000 in the 2024 Capital Budget Application which includes \$19,711,000 that would be expended in 2025 and 2026. Please confirm that NP proposes a capital spend of \$115,252,000 in 2024 (includes previously approved projects).
 - a) Please identify any other capital expenditures that are not included in these figures such as the proposed MUN-T2 transformer replacement.
 - b) NP indicates (Application, para. 3) that in 2024 it intends to demand \$2.5 million in contributions in aid of construction from its customers. Does this mean that of the \$115,252,000, the amount of \$112,752,000 (i.e., \$115,252,000 \$2,500,000) will affect rate base and that the \$2.5 million will not affect rate base?
- A. Newfoundland Power's *2024 Capital Budget Application* is seeking approval of capital expenditures associated with:
 - (i) proposed single-year 2024 capital expenditures of \$84,583,000 comprising projects and programs costing in excess of \$750,000;
 - (ii) proposed single-year 2024 capital expenditures of \$10,514,000 comprising projects and programs costing \$750,000 and under;
 - (iii) proposed multi-year projects commencing in 2024 with capital expenditures of \$5,234,000 in 2024; and
 - (iv) ongoing multi-year projects previously approved in Order No. P.U. 36 (2021) and Order No. P.U. 38 (2022) with capital expenditures of \$14,921,000 in 2024.

Capital budget expenditures for 2024 total \$115,252,000.1

Newfoundland Power is also seeking approval of capital expenditures associated with proposed multi-year projects commencing in 2024 with capital expenditures of \$19,414,000 in 2025 and \$297,000 in 2026.²

- a) The only capital expenditures not included in the amounts outlined in part a) are related to the replacement of power transformer MUN-T2 approved by the Board in Order No. P.U. 14 (2023). Capital expenditure estimates associated with the replacement of the MUN-T2 power transformer are \$48,000 in 2023 and \$1,566,000 in 2024.
- b) Contributions in aid of construction represent the cost of utility property, plant and equipment contributed by customers and government. When these contributions are received, they are recorded as a reduction to the cost of utility property, plant and

equipment. As such, contributions received in 2024 will reduce the Company's total rate base in that year. $^{\rm 3}$

Each contribution in aid of construction is calculated in a manner approved by the Board.⁴ The contribution may not include 100% of the actual capital expenditure and may not necessarily be recovered in the same year as the associated capital expenditure is incurred.

Similar to capital budget expenditures, the \$2.5 million contributions in aid of construction figure is a budget estimate. The impact on the Company's rate base will depend on the actual contributions in aid of construction that occur in 2024. For example, see Return 3 of the Company's 2022 Annual Report.
