- Q. (Reference Application and Board Order P.U. 14(2023)) In Order No. P.U. 14(2023) (Page 5), it is stated "Newfoundland Power's approved cost of service and customer rates do not currently provide for specifically-assigned charges for general service customers. Such a significant change would require a full review of Newfoundland Power's cost of service and customer rates with the input of stakeholders, likely in a general rate application."
  - a) Did NP submit evidence that it would be necessary to wait until there is a general rate application (GRA) before the cost of the MUN-T2 transformer replacement could be charged to the university? If so, please provide the source.
  - b) Will NP request a full review of specifically-assigned charges at its next GRA, at least for General Service Rate 2.4 customers, to ensure consistency between the treatment of its customers and those of NL Hydro?
  - c) When does NP expect to file its next GRA?
- A. a) See part a) of the response to Request for Information CA-NP-032.
  - b) As stated in Newfoundland Power's response to the Consumer Advocate's request to re-hear the MUN-T2 application, the Company observes that the load profile of Memorial University is expected to change substantially in the coming years due to the planned installation of electric boilers, the addition of new buildings, and potentially establishing a capacity assistance agreement. In the Company's view, a review of the rates charged to Memorial University would be appropriate when these changes materialize to ensure the university continues to pay rates that are consistent with the cost of providing it with electrical service.<sup>1</sup>
  - c) Order No. P.U. 3 (2022), as amended, requires Newfoundland Power to file its next general rate application no later than June 1, 2024. The Company will file in advance of June 1, 2024, however, a specific filing date has not yet been determined.
