Are the Board's Provisional Capital Budget Application 5 6 Guidelines consistent with legislation and the need to ensure projects are 7 carried out in an environmentally responsible manner? 8 9 A.
- 9 A. Part II of the Provisional Guidelines provides an overview of the legislative framework
 10 that governs public utility capital budget applications. The relevant legislation includes
 11 the *Electrical Power Control Act, 1994* (the "EPCA"), sections 3 and 4.¹

Section 3(b)(iii) of the EPCA was amended in May 2023 to state that "*all sources and facilities for the production, transmission and distribution of power in the province should be managed and operated in a manner that would result in power being delivered to consumers in the province at the lowest possible cost, in an environmentally responsible manner, consistent with reliable service.*"²

The Provisional Guidelines have not been demonstrated to be in conflict with this
 provision. Part I of the Provisional Guidelines states that the Provisional Guidelines
 "supplement the provisions of the legislation and if a conflict arises the legislation prevails." Consequently, the Provisional Guidelines are consistent with the legislation.
