- Q. It is stated that the current state assessment of Newfoundland Power's asset management identified twenty-two opportunities to be assessed as part of the ongoing asset management review. The schedule on page 27 indicates that the assessment started in October, 2022 and was scheduled to take eighteen months with recommendations anticipated in the first quarter of 2024. Please provide an update on this review, including whether the review is proceeding as indicated in the schedule.
 - Newfoundland Power is assessing each of the opportunities identified in the Current State Assessment. The Company has grouped the opportunities into seven milestones to be completed as a part of a Target State Assessment. To date, four of the seven milestones are substantially complete and will inform the remaining milestones.

Initiatives completed in these four milestones include: (i) a library of documentation was compiled which establishes how Newfoundland Power conducts asset management; (ii) internal knowledge capacity was built upon through a five-day Institute of Asset Management training course by an external consultant, after which 20 employees became certified in asset management via this institute; (iii) engagement sessions were held with Newfoundland Power employees across the island, including knowledge transfer from the asset management training course; and (iv) a pilot project was completed which helped to inform the approach to Newfoundland Power's asset management journey.¹

The remaining three milestones included in the Target State Assessment are proceeding according to schedule. It is anticipated that the Process and Planning Review milestone will conclude in October 2023, the Data and Technology Assessment milestone will conclude in January 2024, and the Resource Assessment milestone will conclude in March 2024.²
