Newfoundland Power's distribution planning processes, documentation, and participation in industry organizations and with peers ensures proper planning of the distribution system. Newfoundland Power's distribution system is planned and constructed in a manner consistent with its *Distribution Planning Guidelines, Service and Metering Guide,* and *Schedule of Rates, Rules and Regulations*. The Company's *Distribution Planning Guidelines* are consistent with the *Distribution Planner's Manual* produced by the Distribution Line Asset Management Interest Group of the Centre for Energy Advancement through Technological Innovation, to which Newfoundland Power was a contributor. In addition, Newfoundland Power's System Planning Department coordinates regularly with Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro's ("Hydro") System Planning Group to support Hydro's annual Transmission Planning Assessment. Newfoundland Power's plans related to the distribution network over the next five years, including information related to electrification opportunities and the Provincial Government's *Renewable Energy Plan*, are contained within the *2025 Capital Budget Application*, including the *2025-2029 Capital Plan*.
