- In its 2025 Capital Budget Application, Hydro has stated it has established a Q. process of undertaking a thorough review of its previously approved multi
 - year projects to identify opportunities for budget refinement for ongoing projects or programs.
 - a) Does Newfoundland Power follow a similar process? If not, why not.
 - b) Would a thorough review of the planned expenditures of multi-year projects in advance of filing the annual capital budget application in 2024 have resulted in additional information being provided to the Board on the anticipated increase in spending on the ongoing rebuild Transmission line 94L? If not, why not?
 - a) Yes, Newfoundland Power conducts reviews of its previously approved multi-year projects throughout their execution. Doing so allows the Company to manage these projects as a whole, ensuring they are on track to remain within the approved budget and schedule throughout the project's lifecycle. It also allows Newfoundland Power to refine the project budgets, should it become necessary, during the execution of the project.
 - b) A review of the planned expenditures associated with multi-year projects was completed by Newfoundland Power during the development of the 2024 Capital Budget Application.

Newfoundland Power conducted a review of the Transmission Line 94L Rebuild project in the first quarter of 2023 during the initial development of the 2024 Capital Budget Application. At that time Newfoundland Power had no information indicating a potential significant increase in the forecasted cost of the project as a whole.

As outlined in part b) of the response to Request for Information PUB-NP-033, in April of 2023 Newfoundland Power received tender pricing for Scope 1 of the project which resulted in an increase in forecasted project cost of approximately 14%. Newfoundland Power reviewed potential re-routing options for Scope 1 confirming the approved route remained the least cost option, and then proceeded with the construction of Scope 1.

In July 2023, following the submission of the 2024 Capital Budget Application, Newfoundland Power received Scope 2 pricing which increased the forecasted cost of the project to approximately 38%. Newfoundland Power did not award this work, and instead completed a thorough review of the project and available alternatives. This review led to Newfoundland Power refiling Scopes 2 and 3 of the project for approval with the Board in the 2025 Capital Budget Application based on the increase in project cost.
