- Newfoundland Power originally registered the Transmission Line 94L Rebuild project with the Environmental Assessment Division of the provincial government on January 26, 2022. The provincial government's Environmental Assessment Regulations legislate that a decision on a registered project will be provided by the Minister within 45 days of the original registration. Based on this, Newfoundland Power expected to receive a decision on the registration by March 12, 2022. As discussed in report 3.2 Transmission Line 94L Rebuild of the Company's 2025 Capital Budget Application, this process ultimately took months longer than anticipated, with the Environmental Assessment Division requiring numerous deadline extensions to review the project. A final decision releasing the project from further environmental assessment review was provided on September 1, 2022. At this point, much of the 2022 construction season had passed, and Scope 1 of the project, which was originally scheduled to be constructed in 2022, was rescheduled to the following year.
- Newfoundland Power does not anticipate any further delays in completing the project prior to the end of 2026.
