15	WHEREAS Hydro is a corporation continued and existing under the <i>Hydro Corporation Act</i> , is		
16 17	a public utility within the meaning of the Act, and is subject to the provisions of the EPCA; and		
18	WHEREAS subsection 41(3) of the Act states that a public utility shall not proceed with the		
19 20	construction, purchase or lease of improvements or additions to its property where:		
21	a) the cost of construction or purchase is in excess of \$50,000; or		
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23	b) the cost of the lease is in excess of \$5,000 in a year of the lease,

26	WHERE AS in Order No. D.H. 26/2009) issued December 22, 2009 the December and inter-		
27	WHEREAS in Order No. P.U. 36(2008) issued December 23, 2008 the Board approved, <i>inter alia</i> , Hydro's 2009 Capital Budget of \$47,856,000; and		
28 29	ana, Hydro's 2009 Capital Budget of \$47,836,000; and		
30	WHEREAS in Order No. P.U. 4(2009) the Board approved a supplementary 2009 Capital		
31	Budget expenditure of \$351,000 for the replacement of the power transformer at the Wiltondale		
32	terminal station due to a failure of the existing transformer; and

34	WHEREAS in Order No. P.U. 8(2009) the Board approved a further supplementary 2009		
35	Capital Budget expenditure of \$1,092,900 for the replacement of programmable logic controllers		
36	at the Holyrood Thermal Generating Station's Gas Turbine Plant; and		

WHEREAS in Order No. P. U. 10(2009) the Board approved a further supplementary 2009 Capital Budget expenditure of \$703,700 for the upgrade of the continuous emission monitoring system at the Holyrood Thermal Generating Station; and

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WHEREAS in Order No. P. U. 16(2009) the Board approved a further supplementary 2009 Capital Budget expenditure of \$93,000 to extend the parking lot at Hydro Place; and

WHEREAS in Order No. P. U. 19(2009) the Board approved a further supplementary 2009 Capital Budget expenditure of \$191,600 for the installation of cold reheat condensate drains and high-pressure heater trip on Unit 2 at the Holyrood Thermal Generating Station; and

WHEREAS on May 11, 2009 Hydro applied to the Board requesting approval for the development of an on-line WPC training software program at an estimated cost of \$160,800; and

WHEREAS Hydro submits that the proposed WPC training program is an on-line learning program that will ensure a consistent WPC training program is delivered to employees throughout Hydro, allow practical application of the WPC in a non-life threatening environment, and provide on-line accessibility to the information; and

WHEREAS Hydro states: i) Hydro's existing WPC training program consists of three full days of classroom instruction which is delivered by nine facilitators throughout Newfoundland and Labrador; ii) a recent WPC audit identified non-compliance issues and gaps indicating that Hydro's current WPC training method is no longer adequate; and iii) Hydro's WPC compliance rate is currently 50%-65%, compared to a target range of 90%-100%; and

WHEREAS Hydro states that the Canadian Standards Association (CSA) Z462 Lock Out/Tag Out Standard and the complexity of the WPC necessitates the delivery of ongoing technical training to ensure that all workers clearly understand the importance of consistent application of the WPC; and

WHEREAS Hydro also states that it is responsible under the Occupational Health and Safety legislation to ensure the health, safety and welfare of its workers and to provide a plan for training workers and supervisors in workplace and job-specific safe work practices that are necessary to eliminate, reduce or control hazards; and

WHEREAS the Board issued Requests for Information on May 13, 2009 requesting clarification on several aspects of the Application, to which Hydro responded to on June 1, 2009; and

WHEREAS the Board has considered the Application for approval of the development of an online WPC training software program, including the report filed and the additional information provided, and is satisfied that the Application should be approved.

1.	The capital expenditure of \$160,800 for the development of an on-line Work Protection Code training software program is approved.		
2.	Hydro shall pay all expenses of the Board arising from this Application.
